ORDER ADMITTING AO YONG DAI HOON.

The applicant presents Section Six Certificate No. 962, issued at Canton on July 1, 1904, and visced by Robert M. Mc-Wade, U. S. Consul-General on July 22, 1904. This certificate shows that the applicant is 26 years old, 5 feet, 8 inches tall, with a scar on head and moles on face and forehead. His former occupation is given as a dealer in general merchandise pursued in Heung Shan City during the years 1899 to 1901, and his present occupation as that of a dealer in general merchandise doing business in Yau Lan Moon, Canton, under the name of Yee Lee, the said firm having a capital of \$8,000, the applicant's interest \$2,000. Applicant is shown to have pursued this business in Canton for three years, his place of residence being in Tai Ling Village. Owing to the fact that the applicant's certificate is dated considerably over a year prior to his arrival at this port, he has been carefully examined as to his former occupation, his financial standing and his intention if admitted to the United States. His statements agree in every particular with those made in his certificate which he presents. He offers substantial evidence of his financial standing, and examination of his hands and person indicate that he has never engaged in manual labor. He is therefore admitted.
